

Dechreuwyd wneud clociau o 1745 ymlaen gyda seiri coed lleol yn defnyddio derw ar gyfer y bocs. Sylwch ar ddrws hir y rhai cynharaf, yna drws byr gyda phanel oddi dan. Gwelir wyneb sgwâr yn datblygu i gael triongl ar y grib yna siâp gwddw alarch. Pres oedd y wyneb gydag enw y gwneuthurwr arno, yna yn nes ymlaen gwelwn wyneb enamel gyda blodau ac adar i'w addurno.

Long case clocks were made from 1745 onwards. Oak was readily available and was used by local carpenters to make the box. Later on, mahogany was used for inlay. At the beginning the door was long, becoming shorter with a panel underneath. Notice the square face of the very early clocks developing to a triangular pediment above and then the swan neck, also they had a brass face with the maker's name on it, then an enamel face decorated with flowers or birds.
